The Wellness Community Announces September's Featured Star

Washington, DC - The Wellness Community (TWC) announced today that Patty Silver, a creative expression therapist from Nashville, TN, is its featured *Star* for September. Patty joins more than 170 family, friends, medical professionals, counselors and others who have been honored through *The Star Campaign*, a web-based effort, www.starcampaign.org, which enables people with cancer to honor and reflect on the caregivers who support them. The campaign is made possible by a charitable donation from GlaxoSmithKline Oncology.

Ms. Silver is being honored by Pamela Bradshaw, a breast cancer survivor and participant at The Wellness Community-East Tennessee. At TWC – East Tennessee and TWC's 24 other centers, professionally-led support groups, educational workshops, nutrition and exercise programs, and stress reduction classes are provided for people affected by cancer and their caregivers at no charge. Pamela began attending a weekly support group, yoga classes and other featured programming in 2000, shortly after she had been diagnosed with recurrent inflammatory breast cancer. She met Patty during her guest lecture on spiritual healing practices taught at the Shekhinah Center's "Kathy Norris Breast Cancer Help Program."

Developed in conjunction with Patty's late friend and program namesake, the course uses creative expression, visualization exercises, meditation and other spiritually-based techniques and practices to help people affected by breast cancer find hope and healing in the midst of chaos. While attending the eight-week series, Pamela developed a close relationship with her facilitator, Patty.

"The spiritually-based practices and insight I learned from Patty were an excellent complement to the knowledge, inspiration, support and hope I received from TWC- East Tennessee," said Pamela.

On *The Star Campaign's* website, people living with and beyond cancer can honor their *Stars* by completing a simple form about themselves and the person they are choosing to honor. All *Stars* are listed on the "*Star Walk of Fame*," which serves as a place to share inspirational stories of cancer caregiving. Visitors may also purchase a *Star Campaign* lapel pin for \$5 in support of cancer caregivers, create *Star* certificates, access caregiving resources, and learn about free support and education available for patients and caregivers at TWC.

Upon her recovery, Pamela began teaching yoga classes at TWC- East Tennessee, where she provides support for others who are looking for ways to heal in the face of cancer.
